COURSE SYLLABUS

Clinical Specialty Nursing

Aims

At the end of the course, the student will be able to:

1. Knowledge and understanding skills:
Plan nursing care for individuals with a specialized condition, identifying care priorities and contextualizing interventions in relation to the clinical picture and specific clinical pathway.
2. Applied knowledge and understanding skills:
Apply clinical and theoretical knowledge to meet the complex care needs of individuals in various specialized settings, integrating scientific evidence into nursing practice.
3. Judgment autonomy:
Express autonomous judgments in the assessment and management of patient care, recognizing clinical priorities and critically reflecting on their professional role.
4. Communication skills:
Communicate effectively with members of the interprofessional team and the scientific community, sharing care plans, clinical data, and nursing research findings.
5. Learning ability:
Develop the ability for autonomous learning, deepening knowledge and skills in relation to the evolution of clinical practice and scientific production, and promoting evidence-based effective assistance.

Contents

Present the nursing process through its phases of initial and ongoing assessment, identification of nursing

diagnoses, expected outcomes, and nursing interventions for people with the major oncological, cardiovascular, respiratory, infectious, and neurological diseases.
Present the fundamentals of pathophysiology and the treatment of the major oncological, cardiovascular, respiratory, infectious, and neurological diseases.

Semester

2nd Year, 2nd Semester.

Assessment method

The course features a final exam consisting of a written test and an oral test. There are no midterm assessments.

The written examination consists of multiple-choice questions covering the topics listed in the syllabus. This section comprises 30 questions, divided as follows: 6 from the “Medical Oncology” module, 6 from “Respiratory Diseases”, 6 from “Cardiovascular Diseases”, 6 from “Internal Medicine 2” and 6 from “Neurology”.

The time allotted is 60 minutes.

The oral examination consists of an interview designed to assess critical thinking in relation to the nursing care process.

The final grade is calculated as the average of the marks obtained in both parts. The final evaluation will be announced by the examination board at the end of the oral test.

The overall assessment takes into account the student's level of theoretical knowledge, their ability to apply it within

clinical-care contexts, and their independent judgment.

Specifically, emphasis is placed on the comprehension of the topics covered and the ability to integrate the content of medical oncology, internal medicine 2, neurology, cardiovascular diseases, and respiratory diseases, applying them appropriately to the analysis of clinical-care scenarios.

During the oral interview, assessment criteria include clarity of expression, the appropriate use of technical-scientific terminology, and the ability to analyze clinical-care situations while identifying nursing diagnoses and interventions in a coherent and justified manner. Additional evaluation criteria include the ability to link different topics, the depth of critical analysis, independent judgment, and the alignment of proposed care plans with evidence-based practices.
