Learning objectives

The course aims to deepen and broaden the knowledge acquired in the previous *Macroeconomics* module by introducing topics related to the extension of the Solow growth model to incorporate environmental sustainability, the analysis of short-run macroeconomic equilibrium in an open economy, the role of expectations in macroeconomic models, and the analysis of modern economic policies, both fiscal and monetary. Alongside the study of the theoretical framework, the course emphasizes its application to the interpretation of major macroeconomic developments in Italy and Europe, enabling students to apply the knowledge acquired to analyze the challenges faced by modern economies and to understand the concepts presented in the core literature through the recognition of theoretical models and their empirical applications.

- I. The extension of the Solow growth model to environmental sustainability;
- II. Extensions of short-run analysis: financial markets and expectations; expectations, consumption, and investment; the IS-LM model with expectations and economic policy;
- III. The open economy; the Mundell–Fleming model;
- IV. Fiscal policy and public debt sustainability; Ricardian equivalence;

V. Conventional and unconventional monetary policy; the relationship between monetary policy and inflation.
