Course title

Educating and Caring: grappling with the drifts of Power and Control

Topics and course structure

The first part of the course will focus on key issues regarding the education of adults and the elderly, exploring the interplay between continuity and epistemological, methodological, and procedural ruptures. We will examine the nature of adult and elderly education today and its distinctive characteristics (*proprium*), as well as the identities of contemporary adults and older individuals.

The second part will delve into the intersection of education and care during adulthood and old age. We will analyze how educational and care practices—across various institutional settings and life situations—can manifest as mechanisms of control and power, fostering exclusion rather than the recognition of differences and inclusion. In doing so, we will draw upon the work of authors such as Foucault and Goffman. Focusing on the dimension of psychological and cultural control, we will also examine Good's analyses, particularly within the context of medical care.

Along these lines, we will consider the risk that social and cultural welfare policies may themselves become forms of social regulation, including from a gender perspective.

Objectives

Knowledge and understanding: An effort will be made to develop a greater awareness in students of the importance of always critically problematizing educational and care practices. These practices are often underlying unconscious dynamics of power and control, which in turn are conditioned by external political strategies.

Ability to relate distinct bodies of knowledge and models: the course aims to strengthen the ability to establish connections between the different perspectives through which the course topic will be explored.

Knowledge and Ability to apply knowledge : the aim is to foster an approach that enables a constant, circular dialogue between theory and practice.

Autonomy of judgment: the variety of sources examined and classroom discussions are designed to strengthen students' capacity for independent judgment regarding the issues under consideration.

Communication skills: these will be fostered in various ways—through small-group work during the course, through the nature of lectures designed to prompt questions and the raising of issues

Learning skills: the aim is to enhance learning capabilities rooted in self-reflection and meta-reflection; consequently, developing a pedagogical, decentered, and critical perspective on the topics at hand will be central.

Methodologies

The course material is closely linked to the teaching methods employed, which prioritize student engagement and active participation; students will be encouraged to exchange views with one another and with the instructor. Consequently, the course will include small-group exercises and plenary discussions on key issues that arise. These activities will alternate with lectures (which will nonetheless maintain a conversational style). Reference will also be made to case studies, film clips, documentaries, etc.

The course will be taught in Italian.

Through a dialogic communicative situation with the student, it allows for an effective assessment of their critical understanding of the course topics, their pedagogical analysis skills, and their ability to connect theory and practice.
