Course title

Chinese Culture

Topics and course structure

The course is divided into two modules, each corresponding to 28 hours of instruction. MODULE A focuses on the history and culture of ancient and imperial China (Writing; Thought and religions; Literary genres); MODULE B covers the history, culture and society of modern and contemporary China through the concept of modernity.

Objectives

To acquire a basic knowledge of the main lines of development of thought, politics, culture and literature in China, in order to be able to critically engage with the narratives produced today about contemporary China.

Methodologies

The course is primarily lecture-based, with an interactive component involving student participation in classroom discussions.

Online and offline teaching materials

Classes will be held in presence. Slides will be uploaded to the e-learning space, together with any additional material made available by the instructor.
