Aims

The "Patient Approach" course is designed to introduce students to techniques for approaching patients and the key physical examination maneuvers used in clinical assessment, in preparation for the hands-on clinical training they will undertake in subsequent years. The course covers specific topics in medical and surgical semiotics, emergency procedures, and the skills required for patient interviews, communication, and medical history taking.

Contents

The tutorial activities involve small groups of students working under the constant supervision of a faculty member, laying the groundwork for an initial understanding of theory and the practical learning of various medical, surgical, and emergency semiotic maneuvers. A portion of the training takes place directly in the clinical ward with the support of nursing tutors, aimed at putting into practice the skills previously acquired through the use of mannequins and theoretical instruction.

Detailed program

The course comprises several modules: Medical Semiotics, Surgical Semiotics, Emergency Techniques, Communication Techniques 1 and 2, and Patient Interaction. Please refer to the description of each module to view the detailed syllabus.
