Learning objectives

Learning Objectives (in line with the Dublin Descriptors)

1. Knowledge and Understanding

- Acquisition of the main theoretical approaches in clinical psychology.
- Understanding of the fundamental aspects of psychiatric and psychodynamic diagnosis.
- Knowledge of the general principles of clinical treatment.

Contents

Summary of Contents

The course aims to provide advanced competencies related to clinical diagnosis and the understanding of psychological dynamics, with particular attention to defense mechanisms and personality organizations/disorders, especially within the narcissistic and borderline areas. Affective disorders will also be addressed, along with an in-depth exploration of contemporary models relevant to clinical practice.

Detailed program

Extended Program

- General aspects of clinical practice – theoretical foundations
- Descriptive framework according to the DSM-5
- Defense mechanisms
- Psychodynamic assessment: personality organizations and disorders
- Clinical presentation of affective, anxiety, and personality disorders
- Narcissism and narcissistic disorders

Prerequisites

Basic knowledge of Psychopathology (DSM-5) and Dynamic Psychology is required. Students who do not possess this background are encouraged to inform the instructor in order to receive supplementary reading materials.

Teaching methods

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Lectures (approximately 70%)

Interactive activities and clinical applications (approximately 30%)

Use of clinical materials, videos, and guided discussions

Assessment methods

There are no ongoing (in-itinere) assessments.

The exam consists of:

- A written test (30 multiple-choice questions; minimum score of 18/30 required to access the oral exam)
- An oral exam covering the entire programme, including prerequisites

The multiple-choice questions are aimed at extensively assessing the student's preparation, while the open-ended questions are designed to evaluate the ability to reason critically and make connections between the knowledge acquired. The evaluation criteria are: accuracy of answers for closed-ended questions, and adequacy of content, logical and formal organization, and terminology for open-ended answers.

The final evaluation takes into account the overall score obtained in the different parts of the exam, according to the following grading scale:

- **18:** barely sufficient knowledge, minimal applicative and interpretive abilities;
- **19-22:** sufficient knowledge of the fundamental content, with some uncertainties in application;
- **23-26:** fairly good knowledge, good applicative ability with some imprecision;
- **27-30:** solid knowledge, good to excellent command of the content and critical ability;
- **30 cum laude:** fully adequate knowledge, full command, excellent command of language.
