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#### Learning objectives

In relation to the objective of knowledge and understanding:

- To understand the model of restorative justice and the programs that implement it, as well as their application within the Italian legal framework
- To know the main national and international legal sources regulating the application of restorative justice programs
- To understand the principles and characteristics of the restorative paradigm, also in contexts beyond criminal justice, with particular attention to social and community settings
- To understand the role of the mediator and their equidistance (equiprossimità), highlighting the distinctions and interactions between this role and other social professions
- To explore specific contexts of application of the restorative model, both in Italy and abroad, with particular attention to serious and very serious offenses and the experiences of peace justice
- To deepen the understanding of issues related to the experience of victimization

In relation to the objective of applying knowledge and understanding:

- To be able to describe the process of a restorative justice program in all its phases
- To be able to describe the restorative paradigm and conflict mediation
- To experiment with tools used by expert mediators in restorative justice programs, approaching the practical skills required by this professional role

In relation to independent judgment:

- To be able to take on a role in promoting restorative justice programs in professional settings where there is a legal duty to inform beneficiaries

In relation to communication skills and learning ability:

- To be able to work effectively in a group setting, actively participating in the exchange of ideas, and deliver an effective oral presentation on restorative justice.

## Prerequisites

No prior knowledge required

## Teaching methods

In relation to critical thinking and judgment skills, the following activities are planned:

- Theoretical lectures, always accompanied by classroom debates and group discussions
- In-class exercises allowing students to personally experiment with the concepts learned
- Role-playing activities with reflective evaluation
- Group work both in and outside the classroom to encourage peer dialogue, always under the supervision of the instructor
- Preparation of written reports

In relation to communication skills:

- Group work involving the analysis of a text and in-class presentation of selected parts to peers, followed by discussion
- Use of diverse modes of expression (legal texts, literary works, audiovisual materials)

In relation to learning skills:

Some lectures will take place in a Milanese correctional facility for adults, with the participation of a group of incarcerated students. This setting is designed to encourage dialogue and the exchange of different perspectives on the complex issue of reparation following the commission of a crime.

The shared learning experience with individuals identified as offenders will enhance students' critical thinking and judgment, improve their communication skills, and provide a broader, more inclusive perspective — valuable for future work in social professions and academic research.

## Assessment methods

**\*\*For attending students: \*\***

Participants will be expected to take an active part in classroom activities by contributing their individual perspectives and viewpoints.

During the course, analytical and reading assignments will be given and subsequently presented and discussed in class.

At the end of the course, participants will be required to prepare a short written paper, which will form part of the final assessment.

In particular, drawing on the lectures, meetings, discussions with students residing within the correctional institution, and the readings assigned by the instructor, participants will be asked to prepare and deliver a presentation. This task will be developed independently through group work and presented in class, followed by a plenary discussion.

In addition, participants will be required to produce a written paper as the final examination assignment, which will also be completed in groups. Students will be assessed on their ability to analyze texts, work collaboratively in groups, deliver effective oral presentations, and produce a written paper demonstrating personal reflection and the ability to develop concrete and well-founded insights.

### **For non-attending students:**

Based on the readings listed in the “Reference Texts” section, students are required to produce a written paper explaining restorative justice and developing one of its aspects (the entries included in *The Book of the Encounter* may provide an interesting starting point, as may other insights drawn from the assigned texts). Students may choose a key concept related to restorative justice and mediation, or a topic that particularly interested them, and analyze it. Alternatively, they may identify a specific conflict case and imagine a mediation intervention, for example a conflict encountered in their professional field (for those already employed) or in other contexts such as current events, film, or literature.

The paper should include a brief descriptive section on restorative justice and mediation that draws on and reflects the assigned readings. Its primary focus, however, should be a personal reflection connected to the conflict analyzed, as well as to the potential and limitations of restorative justice programs and mediation practices that could be implemented in the case under examination. Students will be assessed on their ability to connect the studied texts to the written assignment, which must include personal reflections and concrete insights..
