

COURSE SYLLABUS

Administrative Regulation

Learning objectives

Upon successful completion of the course, students will have acquired:

- Knowledge and understanding of the administrative law aspects of the regulation of publicly owned and publicly participated companies within the Italian legal system;
- The ability to understand and analyse, including through the examination of practical cases and judicial decisions, the interests involved and the functions performed by the relevant legal rules;
- Independent judgment in the interpretation of legal provisions and in the identification of the most appropriate legal solutions;
- Communication skills in presenting and discussing legal issues and arguments, both orally and in writing;
- The ability to engage in autonomous learning, including through the consultation of legislative, doctrinal, and case-law sources.

Contents

The course examines the main aspects of the legal framework governing publicly owned and publicly participated companies, with particular reference to the Consolidated Act on Publicly Owned Companies (Legislative Decree No. 175 of 19 August 2016) and to the structural features of the so-called in-house provision of services model.

Detailed program

- Public economic initiative under the Constitution;
- Public undertakings, Services of General Economic Interest (SGEI) in European Union law, and Legislative Decree No. 201/2022;

- Publicly owned and publicly participated companies and the organizational models of Public Administration;
- So-called in-house companies: the origins and evolution of the phenomenon;
- In-house awards under the Consolidated Act on Publicly Owned Companies and the new Public Contracts Code.

Prerequisites

Foundational knowledge of Administrative Law.

Teaching methods

Face-to-face lectures (direct instruction) with the active participation of students.
Up to 7 hours of teaching may be delivered remotely through synchronous online sessions.

Assessment methods

Assessment of learning outcomes is based on an oral examination covering the topics discussed during lectures and the prescribed course materials. The examination is designed to assess students' ability to explain, understand, and apply the concepts studied, as well as their critical judgment and appropriate use of disciplinary terminology.

Students may also take a written examination at the end of each module. The written examination consists of multiple-choice questions, short open-ended questions, and a case-study analysis.

Course materials will be provided by the instructor and uploaded to the e-learning platform throughout the course, in accordance with the topics covered in each lecture.
