Learning objectives

- Knowledge and understanding: the course aims to provide students with essential bases of knowledge of rules on public contracts and tender procedures.
- Applying knowledge and understanding: the course aims to provide students with tools to develop approaches and methodologies for legal review of public contract law.
- Making judgments: the course aims to provide students with the tools to critically evaluate the various issues concerning the public tenders.
- Communication skills: students will acquire the technical language necessary to appropriately discuss issues relating to public contracts.
- The student will develop independent learning ability, through the consultation of normative sources, doctrine and jurisprudence.

Contents

Subject of the course is the study of principles and regulation of the public markets with a particular focus on works and services public contracts and concessions.

- The new public procurement Code (d.lgs. n. 36/2023)
- public procurement contracts and concession, public-private partnerships;

Prerequisites

Knowledge of administrative law

Teaching methods

Frontal class-room lessons, in delivery mode. Some lessons - at most 8 hours - could be recorded and uploaded on e-learning

Assessment methods

Oral examination. The oral exam consists of an interview on the topics illustrated in the program and indicated in the recommended study texts; particular attention is paid to the in-depth parts during the lessons; the objective is to verify the ability to understand and explain in a clear and personal way all the topics and fundamental aspects of the subject.

During the examination, the following will be assessed:

- (a) knowledge and understanding of the fundamental content of the subject;
- (b) the ability to present information using appropriate legal terminology;
- (c) the ability to apply acquired knowledge through personal synthesis;
- (d) the ability to argue solutions using critical reasoning and to situate legal concepts within the context of the system.

There may be one or more optional written test for attending students.

The study materials – for both attending and non-attending students – will be specified during the course and uploaded on the e-learning page in connection with the single lessons and topics.

Non-attending students are requested to contact the professor by e-mail to receive indications on the material to be used for exam preparation.
