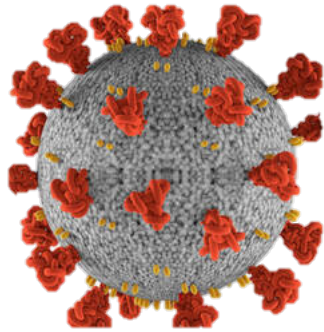

# Life Design Psy-Lab

# Organization

  - Master Degree Course: AEPS

# University Organization

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- Governing bodies of study programmes in our University and in Italy
  - Program Board
  - Departmental Council
  - Students-Instructors Joint Committee

# Program Board (Consiglio di Coordinamento Didattico – CCD)

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- Members:
  - All instructors of courses
  - Student's representatives
- Duties
  - Organization of program structure (e.g., Activation of new courses, disactivation of courses, modification of program structure)
  - Analysis and discussion of problems arose during the semester
  - Definition of program guidelines on internship, thesis, etc....
  - Definition of admission rules

# Students-Instructors Joint Committee

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- 5 Professors + 5 students
- Meet at least three times a year.
- Discusses problems regarding courses and proposes improvements

# What if problems arise?

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- Talk to the teachers  
If the problem persists
- Talk to the student representatives. They will talk to:
  - Coordinator
  - CCD
  - Head of the Psychology Department
  - Joint Students-instructor committee.

# AEPS Structure

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- College Credits (USA) – ECTS (Europe) – CFU (Italy)
  - 1 CFU = 25 hours of study+classes
- For AEPS a total of 180 CFU (64 in the first year)
- CFU can be acquired via:
  - **Courses** which have a final exam with grades (72-80 CFUs)
    - Each course counts for 8 CFUs
    - You have to take 9-10 courses
  - **Labs** which have a final assignment with a pass/fail grade (16-20 CFUs)
    - Each lab counts for 4 CFUs
    - You have to take 4-6 labs
  - **Internship** (8CFUs)
  - **Thesis** (16 CFUs)

# International mobility

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## ERASMUS+ TRAINEESHIP

Erasmus+ Traineeships is the EU-promoted student mobility programme which gives students a chance to broaden their vocational and training curriculum by working abroad in any public sector organization or a private commercial enterprise located in European countries that have joined the Erasmus+ Programme.

The duration of traineeships under this programme is from 2 to 12 months and students may receive a EU grant to help you cover your costs.

# Credit acquisitions

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- There are different modalities to acquire the credits you need:
  - **Labs:**
    - PASS/FAIL grade
    - You have to attend at least 70% of lab hours
    - You have to complete the assignments given by the instructor in a satisfactory manner
    - There is only 1 «examination» session at the end of lab classes (often the last day of classes)

# Credit acquisitions

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- There are different modalities in order to acquire the credits you need:
  - **Course:**
    - Grade scale 0-30 (honorary mention can be added)
    - To pass an exam you need at least 18/30
    - Attending is not mandatory but strongly suggested
    - There are minimum 5 examination sessions each accademic year  
(January/February/June/July/September) at the end of classes (often the last day of classes)

- I semester (October-December)
- II semester (March-May)

- Exams

- Winter Session (January/February)
- Summer Session (June/July)
- Autumn Session (September)



# Study plan

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- Study plan defines which courses/labs etc. you have to pass in order to get the degree.
- The internship, the thesis and some courses/labs are mandatory (these are already assigned to you in the study plan), for others the choice is up to you
- Study plans are personalized
- You will have only one window this academic year to define your study plan (i.e., first two/three weeks of February). -> *dedicated meeting in February*
