Internship classes (TPV)

Up to 8 CFUs can be acquired, if not already acquired from the Bachelor's Degree Course L-24, through the attendance to one or more internship classes (valued 2 or 4 CFUs each), which are scheduled in different sessions and can be attended in the 1st or 2nd year.

Access

The Master's Program has restricted access. Access is conditional on verification of curricular requirements, personal preparation, and language competency in English (at least a B2 level), accordingly to what is established in the Admission Call, published on the University website.

Teaching organization and attendance modalities

Educational activities are held in a conventional way (in-person) and they include lectures, laboratory activities and a practical internship (tirocinio pratico valutativo, TPV). Attendance to lectures is strongly recommended. Attendance to laboratory activities and TPV activities is mandatory, to at least 70% of the total number of hours. For the optional internship classes (TPV), the rules established by the Didactic Regulation apply.

Academic calendar and teaching plan

Educational activities follow the university academic calendar.

FIRST SEMESTER 2026/2027:

SECONDO SEMESTRE 2026/2027:

- Start courses: Monday 1 March 2027
- End courses: Friday 31 May 2027

Study plan

At the moment of enrollment in the 1st year, the student is automatically attributed a study plan, called statutory (statutario), including only mandatory activities. Subsequently, the student will need to present a personalized study plan where they will indicate the additional selected activities.

It is possible to present:

- A pre-approved plan (piano pre-approvato) including all possible choices, already evaluated as coherent by the Coordination Council of the Master's program;
- A plan that needs approval (piano da approvare), that allows the student to personalize their curriculum, in coherence with the teaching objective of the Program;
- An individual plan (piano individuale), comprising additional activities that are not already included in the Didactic Regulation, if they are in line with the teaching system of the CdS of the academic year of enrollment.

The procedure and deadlines for the presentation of the study plan will be established by the Department Council and published on the [e-learning](#) page of the Master's program.

Examinations

Exams are held in three different sessions: in winter (usually in December-February), in summer (usually in May-July) and in autumn (usually in September), in compliance with the minimum number of sessions established by the Students' Regulation ([Regolamento Studenti](#)).

CFUs recognition and transfer

Requests for the recognition of CFUs (ECTS credits) acquired in previous academic careers are evaluated by a Commission, nominated by the Didactic Coordination Council, according to the criteria established by the Master's Program and in the

The recognition may involve educational activities that have been completed in previous university careers or other educational and professional activities, in the limits and in compliance with what is established in the Didactic Regulation of the Master's Program.

Requests must be presented according to the modalities and timings indicated by the University and the Master's Program.

Transfer from other Master's Degree Programmes is permitted in accordance with the provisions set out in the admission call.

TPV (Tirocinio pratico valutativo) – Practical internship

- an internship which is completed in the operational context of qualified external institutions, conventioned with the Order of Psychologists and the University (14 CFUs)
- professionalizing laboratory activities in the context of the Master's Program, for a total of 8 CFUs.

The TPV terminates after a positive evaluation by the supervisors. For detailed information about the external internship please refer to the University Internship and Placement Office.

Final Examination

The final examination, after which you acquire the Master's Degree in Psychology (LM-51) which enables you to exercise the profession of psychologist, also comprises a Practical Examination (PPV, prova pratica valutativa), which precedes the discussion of your thesis dissertation.

The Practical Examination (PPV) can be held in English.

The thesis dissertation is redacted and discussed in English.
